I Recall...

The Times They are A Changin(

I lived in 5 different places; attended 7 different schools as well as working for more than 2 years by the time I was 17.

Even so, in those days' life was a lot simpler, and, although I didn't like or feel comfortable with change, I would later recognise that change is always occurring ... in fact it is the only constant in life.

In November 1963 everything changed for my family when we moved halfway around the world, from urban life in **Manchester**, **UK** to the slow-paced country life on **King Island** in **Tasmania**, **Australia**. It was a complete culture shock.

I recall the 1964 song by **Bob Dylan** – 'The Times They Are A Changin". That song had a deep impact on me.

In 1964 it was grainy black and white TV with only the occasional magician or magic show.

The main way to learn magic was to buy books from a magic shop or borrow (very limited selection) from a library.

The earliest TV magic show that I recall is **The David Nixon Magic Show** (1972 – 1977). The early episodes in B&W and later in Colour ... that was a major change.

Later came **Doug Henning** with his TV Specials. With a refreshingly different approach to his magic, he changed the perception of what a magician is. He made magic cool for young people to say they like magic.

1979 saw another change when I moved to Adelaide in South Australia, to get married.

The next major magic show that I recall is **The Paul Daniels Magic Show** (1979 – 1994). Again, he had his own quirky style and his famous catch phrase '*You'll like this, not a lot, but you'll like it*'.

By now computers are beginning to be used by the general public, and the earliest magician computer user groups came into existence, this is way before **Facebook** and other '**social media**' sites. This was the world of very early internet and was DOS based electronic bulletin board system (BBS)

Facebook didn't come along until 2004 – I joined in 2007, it has changed considerably since those early days.

The first 'smartphone' was created by **IBM** (the 'other' IBM) in 1992 and released in 1994 and was called 'Simon Personal Communicator' (SPC). It wasn't until the year 2000 that a <u>smartphone was connected</u> with an actual 3G network. 2007 was the year Steve Jobs and the team at Macworld revealed the very first iPhone. Android phones soon followed.

Facebook groups came into being and with the advent of YouTube and other social media sites such as: Instagram; Tumblr; MeWe; Gab; WeChat; Vimeo et al, magic clips; tutorials; exposés now flood our screens.
