## **Honesty and Ethics**

Originally published in the November 2021 issue of ASM Magic Makers

I can recall being told on many occasions that I am 'too honest for my own good'. Maybe I am, but I was also told that 'honesty is the best policy'.

So I have always tried to be honest and ethical.

In my developing years in magic (11 year old to around 17) and before I knew about 'Crediting' sources, I learned and performed magic from my **David Nixon Magic Set** or from books I had borrowed from the Library or bought from second hand book stores.

I have always had a good memory for the things I am interested in, and have indeed, on occasion corrected, people (Maybe not the best way to make friends) including during magic lectures.

I recall a particular visiting very well-known lecturer, in **Adelaide**, describing one of 'his' routines. I told him that this routine is by 'XXXX' and it could be found on page 202 of '????'. This threw the lecturer into confusion and he made a comment to the effect that he didn't worry much about sources.

Rather than give the impression that this was his work, I would much prefer him saying that he didn't know the origins of the routine.

A magician I know (I will not name) says he, and has on his web pages, has awards that he has been awarded, however, these are fictitious and don't exist, not only, but if challenged, immediately goes on the defensive, and says that he would call his lawyer, if his claims are disputed. This same person says that when he was on a visit to the **USA** that he was sought out to headline at the **Magic Castle**.

Not only are his claims totally false, but this is absolutely unethical behaviour.

I recall mentioning in a previous column, (**Telling Tales** – March 2020) a 'magician' walking past me while I was working a gig, talking on his phone about an upcoming huge gig in New York, when his phone started ringing!!!

Some years ago I had the trick, 'The No. 2 Pencil' by Mark Jenest. A very good friend of mine also had this trick and it was in his working close up act, so in deference to him I refrained from performing it. In addition, I gave him mine for if his wears out or breaks.

Another trick I always liked and would have liked to have in my act was an act with matchboxes, once again a good friend of mine who was known as 'Mr. Matchbox' was already working with Matchboxes, so once again I did not do a routine with Matchboxes.

I became well known for performing my routine with the **Jerry Andrus Linking Pins**. I have over the years shown my routine to thousands of people, and in fact sold a set to a 'friend' and taught him my routine, with the caveat that he is **NOT** to perform it when I am working the same gig, and if asked he is to give me credit and **NOT** under any circumstances to show it on Television. He disregarded all of my imposed conditions, including performing it on Television.

While the restrictions may not be legally enforceable, I believe that his actions were not in the spirit of the agreement, and it was unethical of him.

I like to think that any product I sold had the appropriate credits listed.

Also when asked about the tricks; routines or bits and piece I use, I try to correctly acknowledge my source (s), e.g. a comedy spoof on the 6 card repeat, my source was **Steve Walker**.

A gag line when I show a card (QH) with its back to the audience, if when asked to name a playing card, if they name the QH I turn the card around and show it matches, if they name **ANY** other card, I look at the card but don't show the audience and say 'You are absolutely right' then throw the card away – this line is from **Tony Ivens**.

I make no claim to getting things right, or acting ethically all of the time, but I like to think I at least try.

This is John Ivan Palmer's account of growing up while traveling in a trailer, going from show to show with his father Jack Pyle, a professional magician and his mother who assisted in the shows. At times funny, shocking and even tragic, this is a unique and fascinating one of a kind book, as are some of the odd characters we meet: a ventriloquist, a simul-talker, a man who uses a bullwhip to knock dimes off of his wife's head, the guy who's act consisted of doing a handstand on one finger, these are some of the people we meet who are just trying to etch out a living in post war America, before television ruled and live shows were the norm.

I recently reached out to the author, complimenting him on his book and thanking him for sharing so many details of his life. When asked if he would answer a few questions for this review, he graciously agreed.

- J.S: You are currently a successful writer and also work as a hypnotist, is that correct?
- J.I.P: Has always been the case; I also did magic early in my career.
- J.S: What was the most important thing you learned from you father?
- J.I.P: Endurance, how to travel fast over long distances; to do as many shows as humanly possible.
- J.S: Thank you again, last one:

You saw your father perform in the 50's as well as many different acts and have been around/involved with magic for many decades. What, in your opinion has changed the most about magic since the time your father performed live?

J.I.P: Definitely the marketplace, there is no longer an industry of agents to work within.

I urge you all to pick up a copy of Master of Deception as I've really never read another book like it.

It was published in 2020 by Rare Bird Books. You can get a copy from Vanishing Ink or online.


