The timekeeper was **Simon Cassegrain**. **Blake** scored enough points to win the **Rick Honey** trophy. Congratulations to **Blake**. **Blake's** grandmother was on hand to see him win this trophy. **Blake** is a very serious junior magician. As there was only one competitor registered for the **Cecil Ackery** trophy, the adult competition could not be held.

Memorable Magic

"Witnessing a close-up magic performance can be an experience so memorable that the spectator will literally remember it for the rest of his life. If you think that's a ridiculous claim, consider this. Have you ever been at a social gathering where people learn that you're a magician, and immediately someone comes up to you and says, "You know I saw a magician one time who did [then follows a vivid, although perhaps inaccurate description of some magic trick]. I'll never forget that!"

I think most of us have had this experience many times. Often the performance that person describes is something he witnessed ten or 20 fifteen years ago or even further back. Yet it made such a strong impression that the moment he heard the word "magician" the experience popped into his head and he was impelled to tell you about it.

Whenever I pick up a deck of cards to perform, my goal is to make such a strong impression on each spectator that whenever the subject of card tricks or card cheating comes up in the future— indeed, virtually any time he sees a deck of cards—he'll think of me. And I know that if I do my job right, that is exactly what will happen. I believe every close-up magician should set similar goals for himself. To do that, you have to focus on making your magic as strong as possible. ... The magician's primary job is to entertain his audience with magic. Not merely to entertain his audience while doing magic, but to entertain them with magic. The most important source of entertainment should be the magic itself"

MAGIC TRICK REVIEW

LET'S SWAP A CARD



This is a fun packet trick I bought on a lark a year or so ago, more to find out what it was and how it works really, as it was cheap and as I guessed, very simple and easy to do, however, don't forget that some tricks that are simple for us to do can be quite amazing for laypeople and this one even shocked a fellow magician friend.

So what is it? You hand someone four cards, you have four cards, you keep them face down and ask them to put the cards behind their back as you do the same; you exchange a card, keeping it face down and you both, while the cards are still behind your backs, turn the exchanged cards over and put them into your small pile. When you show each other the cards, you both have the same card showing face up, for example, the 7 of spades. The spectator will most likely think that all the cards are the same, so you ask him to turn over his four cards as you do the same and he has three cards exactly the same, say the Jack of diamonds and so do you.

So obviously this isn't going to amaze too many (if any) of your fellow magicians, however, it is fun to do and gets a good reaction. Also, the cards are bicycle so they look professional.

Answers to Roy's 5 Question Quiz – February 2024

- 1 Who was known as the '**Whirlwind Illusionist**'?

Horace Goldin

Horace Goldin (December 17, 1873 – August 21, 1939) was a stage magician who was noted for his rapid presentation style and who achieved international fame with his versions of the sawing a woman in half illusion.

Goldin began performing magic on a part-time basis around 1894, combining tricks and jokes and billing himself as "**The Humorous Conjurer**". After he received poor reviews from newspapers he tried again with a new act, for which he hired assistants and adopted a rapid presentation style said to have been inspired by seeing German-born magician **Imro Fox** (1862–1910).[4][7] Goldin did tricks quickly one after another without speaking and became known as "**The Whirlwind Illusionist**."

- 2 Who wrote the book 'Cards as Weapons'?

Ricky Jay

Ricky Jay is known for his ability to throw cards with great accuracy and speed. He was able to throw a card into the air like a boomerang and cut it cleanly in half with a pair of "**giant scissors**" upon its return. The book '**Cards as Weapons**' by **Ricky Jay** is believed to have propagated the myth that cards can be used as weapons, even though it was originally intended to combine instruction with satire. This myth was tested on the Discovery Channel program '**MythBusters**', and subsequently debunked.

- 3 What is the name of the person who punched **Harry Houdini** in his dressing room at the Princess Theatre in Montreal on October 22, 1926?

Jocelyn Gordon Whitehead

McGill University student **Jocelyn Gordon Whitehead** is the person who punched **Houdini** in his dressing room at the Princess Theater in Montreal on October 22, 1926. **Whitehead's** blows either started, contributed to, or covered up (lots of debate about this) the appendicitis that would take Houdini's life nine days later, on Halloween.

- 4 Who is credited with inventing the '**Egg Bag**'?

Isaac Fawkes

The '**egg bag**' is a classic magic trick that involves producing an egg from an apparently empty bag. The origin of the '**egg bag**' is not clear, but some sources credit **Isaac Fawkes**, a British magician who lived in the 18th century, as the first performer of the '**egg bag**'. **Fawkes** was known for his skill and popularity and reportedly earned more than £200 a week from his shows.

The egg bag has been performed by many famous magicians over the years, such as Tommy Cooper, Johnny Thompson, and Penn and Teller. The trick has also been modified and improved by different performers, using different types of bags, eggs, and methods. The egg bag is still a popular and entertaining magic trick today.

- 5 Who is **Richard Valentine Pitchford** better known as?

Cardini

Richard Valentine Pitchford (24 November 1895 – 13 November 1973) was a master magician under the name **Cardini**, whose career spanned almost half a century. Born in Britain, he worked chiefly in the United States of America.

After an unsuccessful attempt to establish himself as a stage magician in British variety, he travelled to Australia, where he performed initially as **Val Raymond** before adopting the name **Cardini**. His new name advertised his mastery of card manipulation and paid homage to the most famous magician of the era, **Houdini**. **Cardini** wore a tuxedo, cape, top hat, and white gloves, and was billed as "The Suave Deceiver".

Cardini subsequently performed in Canada and then entered the United States from British Columbia. While working his way across the United States, he met **Swan Walker** in Chicago, who became his wife in 1927 and lifelong assistant. In New York City, **Cardini** became an almost immediate success, as audiences (and magicians) had never seen such an act. **Cardini** enhanced his performance by incorporating his magic tricks into a skit. Sleight of hand, gestures, and the appearance and disappearance of objects were all precisely timed to music.

DANI DA ORTIZ

AT THE TABLE EXPERIENCE

In this 2015 lecture with Dani Da Ortiz, you will learn how he does some of his card effects and also how he thinks about certain aspects of card magic which may be different from what you already do or know, as the "Spanish" method or school is different, than the way things have been done for decades.



If you know anything about Da Ortiz, you already know that he is an incredible card magician and has been called the star pupil of the legendary Juan Tamariz, which can be clearly seen in his style as they both seem to like to make loud noises and or shout, slam their hands down and use humour (or what they consider funny) in their tricks. This style is not for me and of course, that does not mean I am in anyway better than someone like Da Ortiz (hopefully in 20 years or so, knock on wood), I do believe that listening to what someone of his caliber has to say is worthwhile, even if you don't agree with him or want to use his techniques and or strategies.

There is quite a bit of talking on this DVD, however, as I've said before, I consider the At the table series of DVD's good value for your money as you can get most of them for under \$10.00 U.S.

He is an impressive card magician whether or not you care for his performance style or sense of humour. I did find it a little strange that he, for some reason felt the need to talk about and show his belly at least two or three times, lifting up the front of his shirt; is that supposed to be funny Dani? I don't know and he does seem like a nice guy, but serious dude, I don't need to see your bloated stomach during your lecture, thank you very much (with all due respect).

If you want to watch one of the Spanish card greats and delve into how he thinks as well as see some great card tricks, (as well as his large belly, unfortunately) then check it out. Hey, for \$10.00 bucks you could do worse.

I Recall...

Jamming

I can recall '**jamming**' (A spontaneous gathering where musicians (magicians?) engage in impromptu music-making (magic)) with fellow magicians for nearly as long as I have been involved in magic. Most magicians like to '**jam**'.

When I was living on [King Island](#), we had a few occasions when a visitor to the Island, was also a magician, we would meet and have a 'jam session.'

I can recall one such occasion when we each fooled each other with a card trick, he performed a trick I had not seen before, which I now know as '**The Invisible Deck.**' and I fooled him with '**The Brain Wave Deck.**' When we compared notes, we realized that we were doing essentially the same trick.

In Adelaide, Australia following most magic club meetings some of us would go to a pub for a drink, and we would start 'Jamming.'

I can recall jamming with [Gary Nosigian](#) at a pub following his lecture in the nearby club rooms. He is a truly knowledgeable cardman and a nice person as well.

On another occasion, again following his lecture [Zenneth Kok](#) joined us at the pub for a drink and an impromptu jam session. **Zenneth's** skill with a deck of cards is of an extremely advanced nature.



[Cyril Takayama](#) is another 'Name' magician we have jammed with at the pub after a magic meeting. One of the group showed him a trick with bottle tops, and straight away **Cyril** came up with new ideas and moves with the bottle tops. He is absolutely amazing, his skills were (and still are) incredible.



After his lecture at the Adelaide Magicians Clubroom, we took [Lee Earle](#) to the iconic 24-hour '[Cafe de Vili's](#)' for a meat pie and beer, his session at the **Café** needed to be seen to be believed, he freaked out a couple of the magicians with his abilities.

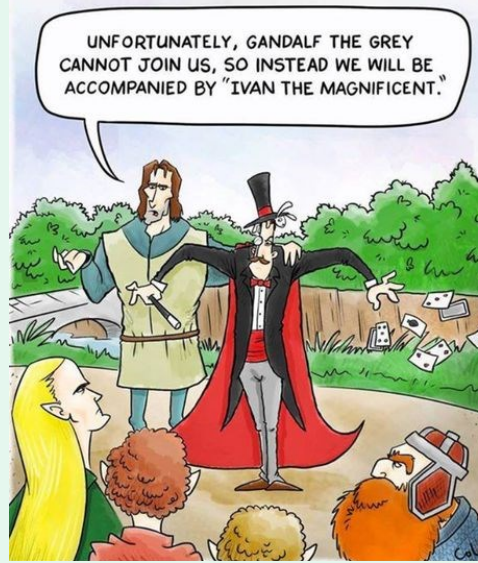

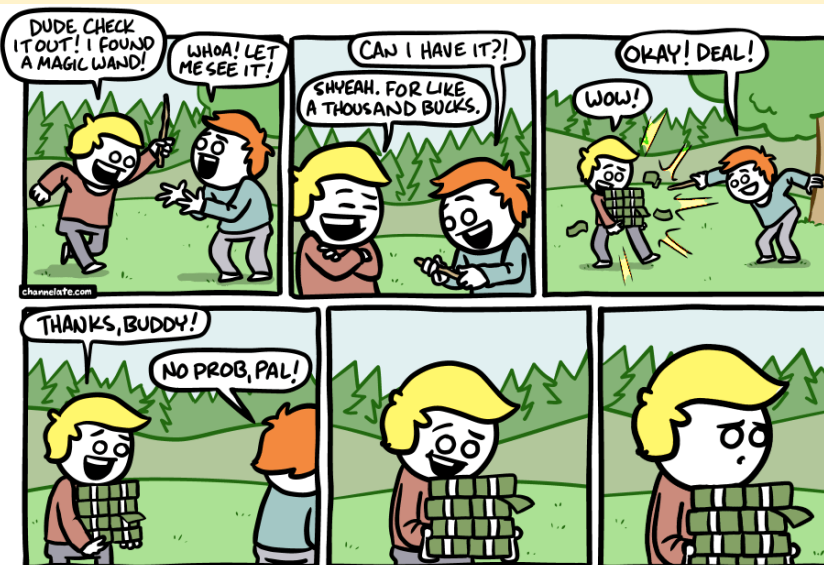
