


# MICHAEL AMMAR LECTURE

At the turn of the millennium, Magic Magazine listed Michael Ammar as one of "The Most Influential Magicians of the Twentieth Century." It's no wonder, as one of the most prolific authors and teachers of magic in the world, Michael's awards and achievements are unequalled. Michael became only the second American in the 45-year history of the event to win the Gold Medal for Close-Up Magic at the 15<sup>th</sup> World Congress of Magic (FISM) in Lausanne, Switzerland in 1982. Since that time, he has amassed 6 awards from the prestigious Academy of Magical Arts in Beverly Hills, California - the maximum number of voted awards for which he is eligible.
