The "What's Nu?" Review

Having seen Alain Nu's "The Mysterious World of Alain Nu" television specials on TLC, I was looking forward to seeing his lecture on February 9, 2007 at Douglas College. I certainly was not disappointed, which is good news (forgive the pun) for Alain, as he gauges his performance by what people say about it after the show is over. Alain got his start in magic at the age of 16, and after working as a restaurant magician and performing illusions, is now demonstrating the "mysterious powers of the mind".

We were all wondering how prepared he was for this lecture. He came out drinking some water, reading his patter from a piece of paper – he even had to put on his reading glasses to read his notes. It then turned out that things really did not seem as they appear as we soon found out that his glasses had no lenses in them, the glass had no water in it, the paper had no writing on it, a lighter appeared out of nowhere and vanished just as quickly, as the paper burnt up in a flash of smoke. That certainly set us up for an evening of unexpected surprises.

He then proceed with a unique presentation of the "Invisible Deck" where an invisible watch (bought at the same store as the deck) also appeared on

his wrist. He then proceeded to demonstrate mentalism with everyday borrowed objects, and three variations on how to determine people's zodiac signs. This was followed by a lengthy discussion on tips for performing restaurant magic, and a trick Alain called "diner" magic.

Following the break, we had the draw for a member to win their admission fee back. In a startling feat of mentalism, Chris Schuh actually drew out his own ticket. Was that a coincidence, or did he learn more from Alain's lecture than the rest of us? From there it was on to our traditional presentations of the coveted V.M.C. pen, the lovely garment bag, as well as the yummy Maple Leaf cookies to the lecturer (with the usual photo ops.).

Alain told us the story of how he ended up getting on television, and the trick that convinced the television executives to give him the specials – an amazing Any Card At Any Number, where the spectator does the dealing of the cards to reveal the named card at the named position. This was, in my opinion, the best trick of the evening.

The lecture finished up with some metal bending, as well a Russian

Roulette trick with cards that could also be done over the telephone.

There were 43 members and 6 guests in attendance, and judging by the conversation amongst us after the show was over, Alain must have been happy with his performance.
