After two meetings of nominations in September and October, nominations were closed off and the nominees are:

We will also be taking a vote on the following Resolutions for the 2011 year. These must be passed at our AGM with a vote of 66.33% from the General Membership. They were passed unanimously by your Executive to be brought forward:

1. Whereas the Vancouver Magic Circle roster book is expensive;

Therefore be it resolved that the roster book be printed every 2 years, starting with 2010 edition.

2. Whereas the Vancouver Magic Circle roster book will now be printed every two years;

Therefore be it resolved that dues be collected for 2 year membership terms, starting with 2012.

 Whereas the Vancouver Magic Circle will be saving money with printing the roster book every two years;

Therefore be it resolved that the dues be set at \$60 for two years for regular membership and \$40 for two years for senior/junior/out of town membership:

And be it further resolved that members must be in good standing at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) and dues paid by Jan 31 of that year for your name to be included in the current roster.

4. Whereas the Vancouver Magic Circle roster book will now be printed every two years and the Executive is listed in the roster book for their terms of office:

Therefore be it resolved that all terms of office be held for a duration of 2 years;

And be it further resolved that elections will be held in the even numbered years, starting with the 2012 election;

And be it further resolved that the President not be able to serve consecutive terms.

We will follow this up with the initiation ceremony for the NEW members and members who have not gone through the ceremony. Some walk around magic was performed before and after the dinner by various members including Dennis Hewson and Jens Henriksen. After the dinner, the competition began and was emceed by last year's winner Rod Chow. Rod can now add emcee to his wonderful list of talents, as he had the room rocking with laughter the whole night.

This year the 50/50 draw was in honour of someone special. Member Munro MacKenzie had put forth a motion at a past meeting for the club to donate \$1000 to the Rachel Columbini fund. While this motion was tabled to a future meeting, we wanted to do a grassroots movement with our members. Those who do not know the story – Rachel is the wife of Aldo Columbini and has a serious heart condition. The surgery in the United States is very expensive and they were in need of help. The Richard Sanders Lecture, Friday, November 12th 2010 A Review by Dennis Chan

Richard Sanders (Hey! He's a Canadian!) started his lecture by doing his version of the "Professor's Nightmare" rope trick and explaining all of the important moves. This was a great opener and thoroughly impressed the 36 magicians who managed to make it out to Douglas College that night to see Richard do his special brand of magic. Following was his mind blowing "Extreme Burn 2.0" effect where he counted out five 5 dollar bills (American of course!), showing them front and back, and then after laying them flat on his hand without any folding or cover whatsoever, he magically changed them into five \$20 dollar bills! The crowd went wild! Not only did he count them out to prove without a doubt they were real twenties, but then he handed them out for complete examination. Next came "Interlace", his version of ring flite on a shoelace. Then, with all of us wanting

more, he demonstrated a mentalism effect utilizing a scratch & win card that had us scratching - our heads! Wait! More! An amazing card effect wherein a card was selected and placed back into the deck. Richard held the deck behind his back, and after making a quick 360 degree turn, the selected card magically appeared hanging from his mouth. His finali was a great trick utilizing the magicians friend - a sharpie, and cap. Didn't take notes? Not to worry, Richard gave us a fantastic deal with several of the effects ready to go with explanation DVD's for a phenomenal price! Unfortunately he had been on the road without much sleep for several days and had to beg off our invitation to go to Boston Pizza afterwards so he could catch up on some badly needed sleep before heading across the border early the next morning. Richard is a very personable guy and we all had a great time at the lecture. Thanks Richard! Clownin Around Magic Shop located on Granville Island, minutes from downtown Vancouver has many latest and rare items in the store. Really! we have stuff tucked away that may not be visible to your eye. We don't have the space to show everything. So just ask.

Take for example decks of cards.
There once was a time when your choice was red or blue now you have more than 20 choices each having its own characteristics. We have a wall filled with specialized decks, colours, different designs as well as decks like Svengali and invisible and the like.

We have the entire collection of the Karnival decks starting with the very first one in the series to the latest which is the Karnival Dead Eyes. A very ancient looking deck in a way more eye catching than the Vintage series from the Ellusionist. It has been tested by a number of XCM guys and they love them.

With the approach of the Chinese new year we have got the Bicycle Zodiac decks and the "Gong Xi Fa Cai" decks. These are very rare and colourful decks that are air-cushion finished and handle very well.

Younger magicians like to own and enjoy these cool looking decks. A wide variety of decks in the store allows magicians to select the one that is best suited for their art in card magic. So much has changed over the years especially the advent of the XCM guys.

Magic definitely now has a new branch which the younger performers like to get into. They put in the time for the practise and it is a delight to watch.

We do carry some gaff decks which opens up a whole area of card tricks that morph before their very eyes.

Some gaff decks have DVDs that can accompany them some are purchased separately.

Recently a local magician who goes under the name of "G" has released two popular DVDs. The V2F and Imagine and has lately released the a new DVD called Cornered. All the proceeds from this two DVD sets will be going to the Vancouver Children's Hospital. We will carry the latest DVD in our store and they have to be per-ordered because there will be only 500 of them made. It's a really good cause and very generous of "G" to help the children in this way. Kudos "G"

If you need something, we can order it in for you, depending on the item we could have it in in as little as the next day. Some things take longer, ask Munro, it took us 3 years but we finally found it for him. Magic tricks do come in and out of stock and some are no longer made. We have had to change our store policy because we have drawers full of "will call" items, so we do need your credit card number or a non refundable deposit to bring a specific item in for you.

A reminder: we do carry both the Magic and Genie magazines and the Reel Magic DVD magazine. They seem to be slipping in popularity so if you like them and want them let us know otherwise we will stop carrying them.


Remember - Dues are Due!

AGM - January 27, 2011 Martin Lewis Lecture - February 4, 2011 CAM / PCAM Convention - July 28 to July 31, 2011


Martin Lewis February 4th, 2011
