

AGIC

I'm writing this on the fly. Trying to get out the door to go to a week-long workshop in Washington state with a person that I saw in Winnipeg. He (Avner Eisenberg) is a person I thought "I can learn from him!"

Avner received a standing ovation in his show. Designed by him to be given to him by us willingly. He then proceeds to show us that the show is not over. He was mistaken. Again, he works hard for us and when he accomplishes what he wanted which was to entertain us while we (the audience) waited for a bigger show to start, the audience leaps to its feet one more time. Get this...that's 2 STANDING OVATIONS in one show.

Now, I have signed onto this workshop. What do I have? A piece of paper that says I've paid and a schedule that goes like this. 7:30 breakfast. 8:30 walk. 9 warm up (seeing we're all camping I think this will be the one I concentrate on) 9:30 morning class. Noon lunch and free time 3:00 afternoon class. 5:30 supper 8:30 campfire. Next day same schedule: there is no definition of what we are doing. class description, or how we are going to do that or how we are going to

accomplish it. Bring toys and warm clothing the note said. Duh? It's raining in Washington? What am I nuts?

So I have the car packed to the rafters with toys that I hope won't cause me to be turned back at the border as some nomadic clown looking to financially prosper in the states. We have a nose for birthday parties you know!

I think I am struck by a few things as I journey out this portal to camp in mid September. I just wonder how easily my money and I are parted....no that's not it. I am going on blind faith that I will get something of use out of this workshop. I have that faith because I was impressed with how this fellow handled his audience, the quality and universality of his show and the little use of any words spoken. I believe him to be a good teacher but more important that I am a good student.

So the guy has impressed me with his talent so I have swung open wide the learning door.

But when do I allow myself to learn from others? Okay when I am impressed or I

have that "envy" of I want to do what you just did. I want to be able to raise in others that sense of enjoyment, awe, surprise or dumbfoundedness I just experienced. It's easy to learn when we want what they got.

I challenge you to learn when it ain't so attractive. Every time you are watching a performer, let yourself fall into that observer mode. What are they doing that you don't do? How have they expanded the trick from what is the usual presentation. What do you like and what don't you like. The hard part is to find the WHY. Don't get caught up in, that guy does a lousy double lift. He flashed blah, blah, blah. It's easy to discount someone you think is less than you. But everyone can teach you something. Allow yourself to learn. It'll keep the imagination bubbling.

There is an old joke about "how many actresses does it take to change a light bulb?" The answer: "47 - one to do it and 46 to say 'I could have done it better'.

Ray Roch's Magic Box/Suitcase Table

The magic box/suitcase table depicted here was built by Jack Hughes in Surrey BC in the early 1940's or there about . . . I bought it from Jack Mellor when his Magic shop was located in the back of his insurance office on Granville street, Vancouver, BC.

Jack told me that it initially belonged to Roy Wheeler, a long time Ring #92 VMC member who used it while entertaining troops during the 2nd world war. (I don't know if the war service link is true?) Nevertheless, at this time (2010) it is at least 65 years old and was used by Roy Wheeler in many of his excellent performances. (Roy Wheeler owned a print shop and was an excellent magician)

When I bought this suitcase/ table, it was covered with Naugahyde and in reasonably good condition. I removed the Naugahyde and a good friend; Ray Bertrand painted it, and the accompanying poster to depict a colourful old-time Vaudevillian or Flim Flam Man.

I have used this table in countless performances at every venue imaginable. It was colourful, mobile and completely self-contained, making it indispensable during close-up magic performances where I had a standing crowd, or was mingling about a fairground or hospitality suite.


There were 31 members, 28 guests and 2 dogs at the picnic. Everyone had a great time.
